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Dear friends,

The Sound Ways Festival has come a long way-it's been a quarter of a century. That's a great deal for a festival and, perhaps, some would call it a day here. When we got started, we were the first and for a long time the only ones to introduce audiences into the challenging world of contemporary music. Fortunately, today contemporary music is performed all over Russia, marvellous interpreters have grown up, new gifted composers have

arrived, along with an exacting audience. Nevertheless, I'm glad we go on. The world has turned out to be more complicated and confusing than the most avant-guard music. And today, I think it vital to try and understand each other, whatever language we speak. Our festival has always premiered works by composers from different countries. There are quite a few of them this time, too. I'm particularly grateful to my colleagues, Western cultural institutes that have helped us bring foreign musicians to our country. They are the English ensemble Melos Sinfonia (they'll give a performance at the opening concert dedicated to British-Russian Bilateral Year), the Danish trio Alpha, the French ensemble Accroche note and the Italian duet of Giancarlo Schiaffini and Giuseppe Giuliano (they used to collaborate with Stockhausen for a long time). In the programme, their performances are named A Lesson of Danish, French or Italian. The opening concert is called English Without Translation, while the Youth MolOt Ensemble's block presenting music by young Russian composers is dubbed At the Russian Lesson, for not only language but also generation gap can sometimes lead to misunderstanding. Let's hear each other and try to understand each other. 100 years ago (which was in 1914, and World War I was on), Richard Strauss's words were published in Russkaya muzykal'naya gazeta (Russian Musical Newspaper): "It's governments that wage wars, while science and arts should stay away from politics and war, and us the representatives of art should not become the scoff of the whole world. ... On behalf of German composers, and musicians in general, I vociferously declare that we are against boycotts and disapprove of yours". In 2014, the great German composer has turned 150 years. A special project of our festival, Homage to Richard Strauss (The Shemyakin Foundation), is dedicated to

him. I have come across the quotation above in a most exciting section 100-year Rhymes in the newspaper Muzykal'noye obozreniye (The Musical Observer), which celebrates its 25th anniversary this year. We're almost peers, and have been friends and collaborators since we were born. The Sound Ways ensemble dedicates its concert to this date. And although there're no works in the program of the concert that would specially pay tribute to the newspaper, all of them are premieres. And Muzykal'noye obozreniye is known for championing and pioneering new music. The festival will culminate in a marathon concert (it was us who once introduced this form into the Russian musical practice), among the participants of which is the Moscow Ensemble of Contemporary Music, an acclaimed and renowned authority on interpreting modern and contemporary music.

Sound Ways will feature works by 69 composers from Russia, Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Hungary, Iran, Israel, Korea, Poland, Spain, Ukraine and the USA. There will be 27 Russian and 19 world premieres. Many talented musicians will perform. And we'll be happy to see our audience at the concerts.
